Psalm 73: The Season of Cynicgiving

1. Infinite Thankfulness (Philippians 1:3-4)

"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer..."

- Circle/underline: all, every, always.
- In Greek: present active indicative "I continually thank... I keep on thanking..."
- But Paul isn't exaggerating—he is living from God's reality, not Rome's prison cell.

2. Gospel Partnership (v. 5)

- Two anchors of Paul's gratitude:
 - 1. **The gospel** the good news of Jesus' love, sacrifice, and kingdom.
 - 2. **Partnership** shared labor in advancing truth, goodness, and beauty into the world.
- The Philippians lived the gospel and supported its advance.
- They were teammates pushing the same mission forward.
- Gospel Friends believers who live for truth, goodness, and beauty.
- Gospel Family spouses, children, spiritual kin shaped by Christ.
- Gospel Significant Others those moving in the same kingdom direction.

Where cynicism grows:

- Trying to do gospel work alone.
- Forgetting that the gospel is always a partnership project.

7. Partners When you don't have to (vv. 7-8)

"You are all partakers with me of grace... even in my imprisonment..."

- Philippi stood with Paul though he was:
 - o 800 miles away
 - A political enemy of Rome
 - o Imprisoned in a dungeon
 - Socially disgraced
- Supporting him was dangerous, yet they did it anyway.
- Their faithfulness revealed the Spirit of Christ at work in them.
- This created a deep, affectionate gratitude in Paul.
