I. Full Circle: From Fear to Faithful Service

- Israel's journey in Exodus begins with fear and distrust.
- It ends with **trust expressed through service**.

II. Spirit-Filled Service (Exodus 35:30–35)

30 Then Moses said to the people of Israel, "See, the LORD has called by name Bezalel the son of Uri, son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah; 31 and he has filled him with the Spirit of God, with skill, with intelligence, with knowledge, and with all craftsmanship, 32 to devise artistic designs, to work in gold and silver and bronze, 33 in cutting stones for setting, and in carving wood, for work in every skilled craft.

1. God Fills Ordinary People for Ordinary Work

- God's Spirit empowers everyday work:
 - Goldsmiths, woodcarvers, artisans, technicians, and builders.
- Every role matters in God's house.

2. The Spirit-Filled Church

- God fills His people to serve His mission.

III. Keeping God's Pattern (Exodus 39–40)

The phrase "as the Lord commanded Moses" appears **18 times** in Exodus 39-40.

1. God's Work Must Follow God's Design

- Moses ensures that every detail matches God's command.
- Healthy ministry is **Scripture-aligned** ministry.

2. The Blueprint of the Church

- The New Testament church was a **disciple-making community** (Matthew 28:18–20).
- When we drift from that design, we lose health and purpose.

IV. When the Work Is Finished (Exodus 40:33–35)

"Moses finished the work, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle."

1. God's Presence Fills Spirit-Filled Work

- When God's people serve together, according to His pattern, His **glory fills the place**.
