EXODUS 25 - LIVING WITH GOD

Text: Exodus 25:1-40

What is it like to live with God in the same "house"?

I. God's Invitation: "Let Them Make Me a Sanctuary" (vv. 1–9)

- Purpose of the Tabernacle: "That I may dwell in their midst" (v. 8).
- God communicates His desire to be with His people.

II. The Ark and the Mercy Seat: God Dwells in Mercy (vv. 10–22)

- 1. The Ark (vv. 10-16)
 - Ark = vault for precious things.
 - Contents: The Testimony (Ten Commandments / Covenant promises).
 - Reminds us of promises made—and broken.
 - Tension: Living with God means confronting our failures.
- 2. The Mercy Seat (vv. 17-22)

"Mercy seat" = place of atonement.

- Blood sprinkled once a year (Lev. 16).
- God speaks from above the mercy seat—the space of forgiveness.
- Fulfillment in Christ (Heb. 12): Jesus' blood secures eternal access, covering broken promises.
- God speaks to us not from condemnation, but from mercy, forgiveness, and grace.

III. The Table of Bread: God Provides Sustaining Fellowship (vv. 23-30)

12 loaves = provision, fellowship, permanence.

- Sustenance Bread as life-giving (protein-rich in ANE; unlike modern "cake bread").
- Fellowship Priests eat in God's presence = friendship meal.
- Permanence Bread is replaced weekly = God's sustaining friendship never ends. God offers nourishing, faithful friendship—never flaky, never draining, always present.

IV. The Lampstand: God's Eternal Presence and Light (vv. 31–40)

Golden lampstand (menorah)

In the ancient world, light meant:

- Wealth oil was costly.
- Protection light drove away threats and wild animals.
- Community light meant presence, warmth, life.

Seven lamps = God's light never goes out.

God's presence is protective, life-giving, and eternal.
